Sample Screen setups using pop-up style.



1) The book pops open, and the map folds out. Note how, because the book is not perpendicular to the viewer's line of sight, there is empty space behind the book that must be accounted for. Also, the map's corners must somehow be attached to the book. Here, an ocean is used.



2) The map itself, in this example, is composed of multiple panes that would pop-up from the page. Although the island is mountainous, this multi-paned presentation is still exceptionally confusing.



3) In this example, the map is the page, but pop-up icons of each of our locations brings depth and perspective to the experience. This would work, except we would need a recognizable icon from every place, and with 23 distinct locations, there would be no room on the map for the map itself. The screen would be cluttered and overwhelming.



4) In this final example, the pages behind the map are what is folded, not the map itself. Because the pages are folded, the flat map still seems to pop up. Although simplistic, the data presentation on the screen mandates a simple presentation. The addition of pop-up buttons makes the interface fun.
